# Garland Amateur Radio Club Equipment Check-Out Procedures

The following procedures will be followed when checking out GARC equipment from the Emergency Communications Center (ECC):

- 1. Only a current GARC member may only check out equipment.
- 2. Only a GARC board member can authorize equipment to be checked out.
- 3. The Communications Officer must be notified immediately of all equipment being checked out by the authorizing board member.
- 4. A GARC Equipment Check-Out form must be filled out before the equipment can leave the ECC.
- 5. Equipment may only be checked out for a 30-day period. If the equipment is needed longer than the 30-day period a new Equipment Check-Out form must be filled out.
- 6. Equipment currently being used to provide Emergency Communications at the ECC may not be checked out (This is to include currently installed radios, antennas, power supplies, and the backup generator).

The club member must replace any GARC equipment lost or damaged while it is checked out.

# **Attention All Amateurs...**

ARRL to Propose New Entry-Level License, Code-Free HF Access (Jan 19, 2004) -- The ARRL will ask the FCC



to create a new entry-level Amateur Radio license that would include HF phone privileges without requiring a Morse code test. The League also will propose consolidating all current licensees into three classes, retaining the Element 1 Morse requirement--now 5 WPM--only for the highest class. The ARRL Board of Directors overwhelmingly approved the plan January 16 during its Annual Meeting in Windsor, Connecticut. The proposals--developed by the ARRL Executive Committee following a Board instruction last July--are in response to changes made in Arti-

cle 25 of the international Radio Regulations at World Radiocommunication Conference 2003 (WRC-03). They would continue a process of streamlining the amateur licensing structure that the FCC began more than five years ago but left unfinished in the Amateur Service license restructuring Report and Order (WT 98-143) that went into effect April 15, 2000.

# **DXCC** rule change adopted



(Jan 20, 2004) -- At its January meeting, the ARRL Board of Directors removed paragraph 1.c) "The entity has a separate IARU member-society" from the DXCC Rules criteria for determining a DXCC entity. This provision, implemented in 1998 as part of the DXCC 2000 Program, had provided that "An entity will be added to the DXCC List as a political entity if it. . . has a separate IARU member-society." Since then, the rule has allowed for the addition of four new DXCC entities and the retention of one existing entity. Unfortunately, the provision also had the unintended consequence of stimulating applicaxions for IARU membership that do not further the objectives of the IARU, creating an unfortunate

and unnecessary administrative burden. The rule change will have no effect on entities created by or as the result of the rule. According to DXCC Rule II, 5. C), "A change in the DXCC criteria shall not affect the status of any entity on the DXCC List at the time of the change." The other two criteria for the determination of a political entity for DXCC continue in effect: 1.a) "The entity is a UN member-state." and 1.b) "The entity (except international organizations) has been assigned a call sign prefix block by the ITU." The Board resolved to amend the DXCC rules by deleting IARU membership as a basis for determining a "political entity."

# Congressman-Ham Asks FCC to Wait for NTIA Study Before Acting on BPL



(Jan 16, 2004) -- US Representative Greg Walden, WB7OCE, has called on the FCC to put off any further action in its Broadband over Power Line (BPL) proceeding until the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) releases the results of its BPL study and the public has had a chance to comment.
