GARLAND SIREN TEST

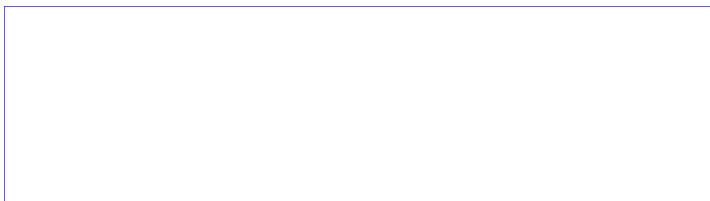
Membership:
